Setting event	Antecedent	Behavior	Consequence

Example: 10:20 a.m., 10/3/10; Reading circle	Example: Teacher asks students to move into reading groups.	Example: Robin starts whistling very loudly.	Example: Other students act annoyed, reading circle is delayed.
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
