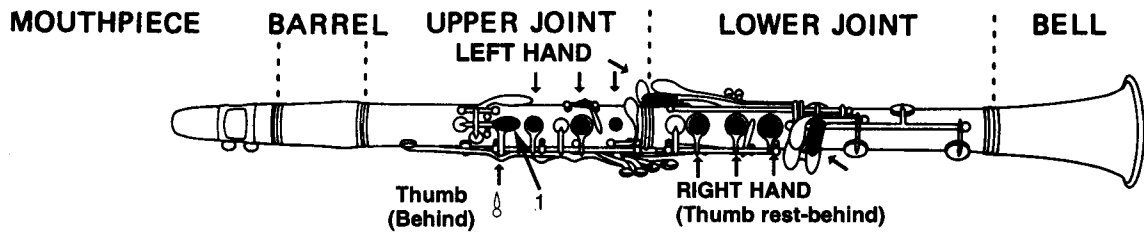


# PARTS OF A CLARINET AND FINGERING CHART



- = press the key or cover the hole with your finger.
- = do not press the key or cover the hole.

When there is more than one fingering given for a note, use the first one unless the alternate fingering is suggested.

Fingering chart for the clarinet, showing notes and fingerings for the upper and lower registers.

Notes and fingerings are provided for the following notes:

- Row 1: E, F $\flat$ , E $\sharp$ , F, F $\sharp$ , G $\flat$ , G, G $\sharp$ , A $\flat$ , A, A $\sharp$ , B $\flat$
- Row 2: B, C $\flat$ , B $\sharp$ , C, C $\sharp$ , D $\flat$ , D, D $\sharp$ , E $\flat$ , E, F $\flat$ , E $\sharp$ , F
- Row 3: F $\sharp$ , G $\flat$ , G, G $\sharp$ , A $\flat$ , A, A $\sharp$ , B $\flat$ , B, C $\flat$ , B $\sharp$ , C
- Row 4: C $\sharp$ , D $\flat$ , D, D $\sharp$ , E $\flat$ , E, F $\flat$ , E $\sharp$ , F, F $\sharp$ , G $\flat$ , G
- Row 5: G $\sharp$ , A $\flat$ , A, A $\sharp$ , B $\flat$ , B, C $\flat$ , B $\sharp$ , C, C $\sharp$ , D $\flat$ , D
